# FANTASTIC NEWS! "Beacon 2" funding secured for 3 years!



Just as Beacon 2 was about to fold because of lack of funding the BBC Children in Need have come to our rescue and we are to receive £35,120 over 3 years to maintain and expand Iames says this service. "This is fantastic news for Beacon 2 which has been struggling financially for the last 5 months after the previous funder closed down. So even after a very successful year for Beacon 2 its future was looking very uncertain.

This gives us 3 years in which we can establish this service more firmly and improve what we do. This is really exciting news!"

Lead B2 counsellor. Yvonne Shelmerdine, says "I am delighted that B2 has been acknowledged by Children in Need as a worthy service for counselling young people. The wait for information leading to a new source of financial iniection became almost unbearable knowing how much hard work that Olivia, James and Pat Loblev had invested. When I learned that our application had been successful I was overwhelmed. The way forward now is to kick-start the engine and raise awareness that B2 is back in business".

Please note—this funding is specifically for Beacon 2 and cannot be used for any other of the Beacon services and therefore it is still vital for us to continue with our programme of fundraising for the next 12 months.

Alex is one of our evening receptionists at the Bramhall office. Born in Blackpool, and a retired dentist, he was persuaded by his wife Vida about 4 years ago "to do something for the community" and so he came to help out.

They perform at various types of private functions but Alex has also been known to busk in Bramhall Precinct to raise funds for Christie Hospital. Very much a "reluctant volunteer" (his own words) he always turns up each week to help counsellors Anna, Pat, Fiona and Yvonne who he says he gets on with famously.
